## **Student Conduct Agreement**

The residential program strives to provide a safe, productive and enriching environment for all students and staff. To accomplish that, we have set rules and guidelines that must be adhered to and agreed upon by parents/guardians and students. Please review the items listed below with your student and sign together once understanding has been reached.

### The following items are <u>not permitted</u> in the dorm at any time:

- Any type of weapon or contraband that may be considered harmful or dangerous to oneself or others
- Any amount of tribally deemed illegal drugs including alcohol, marijuana and other illicit substances
- Any amount of use of inhalants such as glue, gasoline or other chemicals
- Any amount of peyote, tobacco or tobacco products even if for ceremonial use
- Any form of substance paraphernalia including vape pens, pipes, lighters
- Any type of sexually explicit material, including photographic, video and illustrated forms

## The following offenses are considered not permissible:

- Any degree of physical assault between students or students and staff
- Any degree of sexual assault between students or students and staff
- Any degree of verbal assault between students or students and staff
- Any degree or form of emotional abuse/bullying between students or students and staff
- Any degree or form of Cyberbullying between students or students and staff
- Any degree of verbal or written threats of the above listed forms of assault
- Any degree of theft or stealing from students or staff
- Any degree of theft of dorm property
- Any degree of unwarranted entry into the dorm without authorization or with a staff member

- Any degree of intentional damage to dorm structure or property, including vandalism
- Any degree of attempt to conceal prohibited items
- Any degree of intended injury or harm to another student or staff member
- Any unauthorized absence from the dorm is considered AWOL and parent/guardians will be notified
- Open use of foul/offensive language, derogatory terms, explicit language or mention of inappropriate verbiage

Such offenses will result in disciplinary actions ranging from verbal and written warnings, parent/guardian notification, temporary dorm suspension or complete withdrawal from the dorm. Please be advised that we are not limited to these measures and are required to seek legal actions if necessary, depending on the nature of each incident, and understand that they will be dealt with on an individual basis per the discretion of the dorm staff and director.

### **Prohibited Clothing:**

- Any clothing with drug, alcohol, sexual or gang references
- Skirts or shorts higher than mid-thigh
- Fishnet or sheer leggings
- Distressed denim jeans with very large holes
- Crop tops or tops revealing the abdomen
- Low cut shirts
- Tops that reveal undergarments
- Tank tops or camis are to be worn under a shirt or with a cover up

#### **Prohibited Accessories:**

- Spiked jewelry or accessories
- Chains for clothing or wallets
- Safety pin decorations or accessories
