PART I. GENERAL EXPECTATIONS

The <u>Theodore Roosevelt School</u> agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

- Consistent with section 1116, the school will work to ensure that the required school-level parent and family engagement policies meet the requirements of section 1116 of the ESSA, and each includes, as a component, a school-parent compact consistent with section 1116(b) of the ESSA. - Schools will notify parents/families of the policy in an understandable and uniform format and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand. The policy will be made available to the local community and updated periodically to meet the changing needs of parents and the school.
- In carrying out the Title I, Part A, parent, and family engagement requirements, to the extent practicable, the school will provide full opportunities for the participation of parents who are economically disadvantaged, limited English proficient, parents with disabilities, and of any racial or ethnic minority background including providing information and school reports required under section 1111 of the ESSA in an understandable and uniform format and including alternative formats upon request and, to the extent practicable, in language parents understand.
- Suppose the school-wide program plan for Title I, Part A, developed under section 1114(b) of the ESSA, is not satisfactory to the parents of participating children. In that case, the school will submit any parent comments with the plan when the school submits the plan to the local educational agency (BIE school).
- The school will involve the parents of children served in Title I, Part A schools in decisions about how the 1 percent of Title I, Part A funds reserved for parental involvement is spent and will ensure that not less than 90 percent of the 1 percent reserved goes directly to the schools.

- (B) frequent reports to parents on their children's progress.
- (C) reasonable access to staff, opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, observation of classroom activities, and
- (D) ensuring regular two-way, meaningful communication between family members and school staff, and, to the extent practicable, in a language that family members can understand
- The school will be governed by the following statutory definition of parental involvement and will carry out programs, activities, and procedures under this definition:

Parent and family engagement means the participation of parents and family in regular, two-way, and meaningful communication involving student academic learning and other school activities, including ensuring—

- (A) parents/family play an integral role in assisting their child's learning.
- (B) parents/family are encouraged to be actively involved in their child's education at school.
- (C) that parents/family are full partners in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decision-making and on advisory committees to assist in their child's education.
- (D) the carrying out of other activities, such as those described in section 1116 of the ESSA.
