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Wildfire Contingency Plan — ZIP Code 85929 (Fort Apache, AZ)

Date: Current as of latest available updates

Situation Overview

Multiple wildfires are currently burning within regional proximity to ZIP code 85929, producing heavy smoke and creating a high probability of evacuation or shelter-in-place orders. While not all fires are an immediate direct threat, their cumulative smoke impact is significant and can affect health, visibility, and operations. The situation requires readiness for:

- 1. Evacuation with students on campus
- 2. Evacuation when students are at home
- 3. Shelter-in-place if roads are closed or unsafe
- 4. Continuity of instruction during disruption
- 5. Possible use of school facilities by Incident Command

Primary concern: **Smoke exposure** Secondary concern: **Direct fire threat**

Key Observations

- **Bronco Fire**: Largest and most concerning for growth; 0% containment. Smoke drifting into multiple communities.
- Billy Fire: Second largest; 16% containment but still generating heavy smoke.
- Maverick Fire: Smaller in acreage but no containment; forward progress recently halted.

- Four Diamond Tank Fire: Contained but highlights the ongoing risk of new ignitions.
- Diamond Butte, Lookout, Steer Fires: Smaller but contributing to cumulative smoke exposure.

I. Evacuation Preparedness

Primary Evacuation Site

• Confirm use of Hon Dah Casino parking lot.

Secondary/Tertiary Evacuation Sites

• Identify and secure at least two backup sites in case the primary location is compromised.

Transportation

- Keep all school vehicles **fully fueled** and on standby.
- Assign designated drivers for students, supplies, food, water, and laptops.

Communication

- Maintain parent notification protocols (phone, text, email, social media).
- Assign staff to liaise directly with Incident Command and Forest Service.

II. Shelter-in-Place Preparedness

Building Safety

- Close all doors and windows to reduce smoke infiltration.
- Use air filtration systems as long as power is available.

Supplies

- Maintain abundant bottled water.
- Store **non-perishable**, **ready-to-eat food** for at least 72 hours.
- Maintain **first aid kits** and **sanitary supplies** (toilet paper, hand sanitizer, feminine hygiene products, gloves, masks).

Critical Utility Impact – If Power is Cut or Shut Down

▲ Loss of Air Conditioning — increased indoor heat risk

≜ Loss of Water Pumps — no running water

▲ Loss of Gas Pump Access — fuel shortages possible

Loss of Refrigeration — perishable food spoilage

▲ Loss of Lighting — rely on flashlights and batteries

▲ Loss of Computer/Internet Access — offline work required

▲ Loss of Banking/ATM Access — cash may be required

III. Instructional Continuity

Laptop Distribution

• All students will be issued a **school laptop** and **clear backpack** for safe transport.

Remote Learning Platform

- Google Classroom will be used for synchronous and asynchronous instruction.
- Teachers will upload lessons in advance to ensure readiness.

Power Outage Learning Plan

• Students must **download Google Classroom assignments daily** while at school or whenever internet is available to ensure offline access if power or internet is lost.

Attendance Requirements

- Attendance must be recorded daily for instructional days to count.
- There are **no waivers** any days missed beyond **9** will be made up in summer to meet **minimum instructional minutes**.

BIE Requirement

• Per BIE, schools must have laptops and lessons ready for immediate remote learning during emergencies.

IV. Health & Safety During Smoke Conditions

- Issue **N95 masks** to staff and students during heavy smoke events.
- Keep all doors closed and limit outdoor activity.
- Monitor the air quality index from official sources.

V. If Incident Command Uses School Facilities

- Identify and secure areas for their operational use.
- Coordinate to ensure safety of students, staff, and property.

VI. Community & Home Preparedness

- Keep personal vehicles fueled.
- Maintain a go-bag with ID, medications, cash, food, water, flashlight, batteries, clothing, and hygiene items.
- Store **3 days of water** and **non-perishable food** at home.
- Prepare for **loss of power** with flashlights, extra batteries, portable chargers, and battery-powered fans.
- Keep important documents in a waterproof/fireproof container.
- Have a **family communication plan** in case phone networks fail.
- Download schoolwork daily for offline access.

VII. Action Items

Immediate

- 1. Confirm Hon Dah Casino as primary evacuation site; secure two alternates.
- 2. Fuel all school and transport vehicles.
- 3. Complete laptop assignments and distribute clear backpacks.
- 4. Stockpile food, water, sanitary items, and first aid kits.
- 5. Train staff on evacuation and shelter-in-place protocols.
- 6. Provide offline Google Classroom instructions to all students.

Within 24-48 Hours

- 1. Issue N95 masks.
- 2. Test emergency notification systems.
- 3. Verify all teachers have uploaded Google Classroom lessons.
- 4. Conduct a remote learning readiness check.

Ongoing

- Monitor wildfire activity and air quality multiple times daily.
- Maintain daily readiness for rapid evacuation or shelter-in-place.
